The goal is to clear the energy blockages and return the body to its normal flow and function.

As a student in this diploma program, you will gain extensive knowledge of Acupuncture that meets the national competency standards to enable you to to undertake the Pan-Canadian examinations. In Ontario, graduates can apply for registration under the College of Traditional Chinese Medicine and Acupuncturists of Ontario.

Admission Requirements:

- 1. Student has an Ontario Secondary School Diploma or equivalent, OR
- 2. An accepted equivalent by the time the program commences, OR
- 3. Is 18 years of age or older on or before the program begins AND can pass a qualifying test that has been approved by the Superintendent.
- 4. The approved qualifying test for this program is the Wonderlic test. A passing score for this program is 14.

*Applicants from other Canadian provinces must be at least 19 years of age and a minimum of 1 year out of high school by the program start date and successfully pass an academic achievement test.

Skill/Practical Requirements:

- 1. A vulnerable person background check is required and submitted prior to participating in any clinic activity.
- 2. Students must complete all academic pre-requisites and complete 12 hours of Clinical Observation prior to participating in any clinic activity.
